

# So, you are heading to college...

And are wondering how you can access our services. Below, we have put together some steps for you to follow that will guide you and make sure that your first meeting with us is a rewarding one.

## Steps:

- 1. Collect copies of your most recent IPRC, Individualized Education Plan (IEP), any Psycho-Educational Assessment from your file at your current/last high school. Any medical reports about your disability from your family physician, optometrist, ophthalmologist, or medical specialist should also be obtained.**

- Information in your Ontario School record does not automatically get forwarded to colleges. It stays within your file at the last high school that you attended.
- These documents will be necessary in order to determine the level of support and services that you may require.
- Getting the paper work in place is an important first step before accommodations can be provided. However, other services may be accessed through the Centre while you are waiting for your documentation.
- For students without a documented disability, you may still qualify for our services. This interim support will be determined upon meeting with a Disability Advisor.

- Our Transition planner will help you prepare for your entry to post secondary.

### 3. Make an **Intake Appointment** with a Disability Advisor.

- We recommend that you make an appointment with one of our disability advisors once you have decided to apply to Cambrian College.
- A Disability Advisor will meet with you to discuss the services and supports that may be made available to you to accommodate you within your academic program.
